Draft Zion Mission Plan

1. Purposes

The Mission Plan for Zion Church has been drawn up for the following overall purposes:

- To share Christ with those outside the Church
- To develop and enhance Christian worship in response to the circumstances of today
- To contribute to community wellbeing and cohesion through an improved level of service to the local community and also through greater use of the Church's building for community led events and meetings.
- To strengthen the Christian community of the church through learning and caring for one another.

However, it has to be recognised that the human, financial and physical resources of the Church are limited, and therefore it is not possible to do all the things that the church would like to do. So, for new initiatives, priorities have been identified and then translated into specific proposals for action. The Plan will then be reviewed on a 2 yearly basis (or as the necessity arises), in order to assess the effectiveness of the actions taken and to decide on any changes to be made.

2. Priorities for new activities or initiatives are:

The **First Priority** of the Mission Plan is to be: **Service and Mission to Older People**. This can be pursued immediately as it is already the purpose behind many of the church's existing activities. Also, further initiatives are now planned

The **Second Priority** is to **Develop Contact with, and Services to, Young People.** However, some measures proposed here will first need significant research and feasibility assessment.

A Further Priority is to Widen and Diversify Worship, so that worship opportunities are offered which are convenient or relevant to different groups of people.

3. Existing activities

The Plan provides for the continuation of existing activities as follows:

- Worship Sunday worship
- Learning and Caring Priority 1 Fellowship Groups, Pastoral Care, Prayer Chain, and After-service Coffee.
- **Service Priority 1 -** Cameo, Drop-in, Meet and Eat, Holiday at Home. **Priority 2 -** Shoebox collection, (children's) Extravaganzas

4. New Activities

These include both entirely new activities and also activities which the church has previously been involved in but are not current.

a. Worship - Priority 1

• Preaching Plan - a theme to be sustained by Sunday preachers over a period of time. Eg. A preaching plan could follow part of the sequence of Alpha topics during the period of an Alpha course.
