This modern take on the classic carol Hark! The Herald Angels Sing, is one of two new arrangements of carols The Methodist Church is releasing this year. Keep an eye out for their second single, A Midnight Clear, dropping on 6 December.

Finally, on 10 December, Christmas Vol. 1 will be released. This will include last year's single, Be Born (a modern take on O Little Town of Bethlehem), the two new singles, and a bonus soundtrack from the 2024 Christmas film.
